Medication bottles should have all personal information removed or blacked out prior to dropping in the box or medication placed in

a sealed bag. Drop boxes are accessible Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm. ■

YARD SALES

Residents are allowed to have two yard sales per year, no more than one yard sale in any six month period. One sign may be displayed at the premises of the sale only and to be removed at the end of the event. Yard sale signs are not allowed in the public right-of-way; this includes sidewalks, street light poles, stop sign poles and utility poles.

STORMWATER CORNER

Many common household products and cleaners including motoroil. leftover paint, household chemicals, and batteries can cause stormwater pollution if not disposed of properly. Luckily, Escalon residents are able to recycle these items for free at the San Joaquin Household Hazardous Waste Facility, call 209-468-3066 for more information. Dumping these products into the storm system is illegal and can be reported at 209-691-7495. Household batteries can be recycled at Escalon

City Hall. To find other local facilities to recycle your oil, paint, chemicals, hazardous waste, beverage containers, mattresses, and more, visit
