ooking to dispose of your used sharps or old medications in a safe and convenient way? The Escalon Police Dept has secure drop boxes for both, located at 2040 McHenry Ave. Sharps must be placed in a sharps or hard plastic container (no glass). Medication bottles should have all personal information removed or blacked out prior to dropping in the box or medication placed in

a sealed bag. Drop boxes are accessible Monday through Friday, 8am to 5pm. ■

YARD SALES

Residents are allowed to have two yard sales per year, no more than one yard sale in any six month period. One sign may be displayed at the premises of the sale only and to be removed at the end of the event. Yard sale signs are not allowed in the public right-of-way; this includes sidewalks, street light poles, stop sign poles and utility poles.

STORMWATER CORNER

∖ ∧ I hen caring for your lawn or garden, sweep fertilizer, soil and other debris from sidewalks and driveways instead of hosing them off. The flowing water will wash the pollutants into streams, rivers, and lakes. Avoid overwatering after applying lawn and garden chemicals to reduce the concentrations of pollutants in stormwater runoff. Use non-toxic pest controls such as insecticidal soaps or lady bugs for aphids. Wash your car on the grass rather than in the street so the soapy water does not flow directly into the storm drain. To report illegal

dumping into storm drains, please call the Escalon Stormwater Hotline at 209-691-7495.



RECREATION REFUND POLICY

The City of Escalon Recreation Department has a no-refund policy. Full refund will be given if the department cancels the program, the participant is cut from the program, or cannot participate due to medical reasons. No refund after the class/program/league has had its second meeting. All refunds will be given by check only through the City of Escalon. The Recreation Director reserves the right to adjust the policy depending on the circumstances and severity of the situation. ■
