STORMWATER CORNER

esidents and businesses are no longer allowed to put organic debris (including leaves) in the streets for the street sweeper to pick up. The State of California is regulating stormwater contamination and the City is required to comply with State permits. Leaves, soil, bark, grass clippings, and plant prunings are carried through the storm drain system to streams, lakes, rivers, and the ocean. Nutrient Pollution, caused by the nitrogen and phosphorus in the organic materials, causes harmful algal blooms, major environmental damage, and serious health problems in people and animals. Residents are required to use their green waste container

for all organic debris generated on their property. If using a landscape company, please ensure they are sweep not blowing organic debris into the gutter/roadway. ■
