DON'T BE A WATER WASTER!



Basic Rules to remember are:

- ◆ Do not use outdoor water between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. and **NO WATERING ON MONDAYS**
- ◆ Excess water shall not be allowed to leave the property or area of water use.
- ◆ The use of water hoses without a shut-off nozzle is prohibited.
- ◆ Washing down driveways and sidewalks is prohibited.

STORMWATER CORNER

Residents and businesses are no longer allowed to put organic debris (including leaves) in the streets for the street sweeper to pick up. The State of California is regulating stormwater contamination and the City is required to comply with State permits. Leaves, soil, bark, grass clippings, and plant prunings are carried through the storm drain system to streams, lakes, rivers, and the ocean. Nutrient Pollution, caused by the nitrogen and phosphorus in the organic materials, causes harmful algal blooms, major environmental damage, and serious health problems in people and animals. Residents are required to use their green waste container for all organic debris generated on their property. If using a landscape company, please ensure they are not sweep or blowing organic debris into the gutter/roadway. ■
