CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

scalon residents have two options for disposal of Christmas trees - either one is free of charge.

Option 1: You may dispose of your tree as part of your normal garbage disposal service if you follow these steps:

- Remove all objects from your tree including stands.
- Cut your tree into three or four sections and place in your green waste container. Your tree must fit completely.
- Observe your regular scheduled pickup times and dates.

STREET SWEEPING

anuary through September streets will be swept the 1st full week and 3rd week of the month, on either Tuesday or Wednesday; streets NE of Main Street will be done on Tuesdays and the SW side of Main Street on Wednesdays. You can view the street sweeping schedule/map on the Street & Traffic section of the Public Works page at www.cityofescalon.org.

A few simple guidelines:

- Deposit leaves and clippings in your green waste can and not in the street.
- Additional Green Waste containers can be ordered from City Hall and cost less than \$3.50 a month!
- Sweep fallen leaves away from storm drain inlets to prevent neighborhood street flooding.

 Do not place trees on the curb or in the street. Only trees fully contained in a green waste will be picked up.

Option 2: The Escalon Fire District, will pick up trees on Saturday, January 9, 2021. Just place your tree in the street near the curb by 6:00 a.m. Be sure that all ornaments and tinsel are removed from the tree. For more

RIDE Trans THE "EZ" WAY!

PURCHASE YOUR TRANSIT TICKETS THE "EZ" WAY!

Trans has made it "EZ" to purchase public transit tickets on your mobile device. The launch of EZHub, a cashless mobile ticketing and fare payment system, available in the Vamos Mobility App, will make it cashless, convenient, and contact free to plan your transit trip and purchase tickets on TRACER, Manteca Transit, eTrans, Blossom Express, GrapeLine, ACE, and RTD public transit systems. Along with existing measures eTrans has already taken due to COVID-19 to enhance rider safety, this contactless rider experience makes getting on a bus or ACE train that much "EZer". The app is free and the transit ticket is exactly the same cost as a paper ticket. The app is available from both the App Store and Google Play by searching for "Vamos Mobility" or "EZHub". ■

Escalon is too great to litter

Carelessly discarded garbage affects every member of society: it causes harm to people and animals, damages our waterways, and costs us money.

Primary Sources of Litter:

- 1. Pedestrians dropping garbage in streets and roadways.
- 2. Motorists discarding garbage out of their vehicle windows.
- 3. Uncovered loads. Items that are not secure can easily be blown out of trucks and cause roadside littering.
- Household Collection. Wind can dislodge unsecured items placed out on the corner for collections. Litter can also result from overloading trash containers.

Fortunately, we can all do something to help prevent and reduce litter. Help keep Escalon parks

and streets clean by placing trash and recycling in their appropriate containers. ■
