 Sunday, Wednesday and Friday.

Odd addresses may water Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.
Non-watering hours are 8:00am - 8:00pm and NO watering on Mondays.

**<u>ELIMINATE WATER FROM LEAVING YOUR PROPERTY</u>** - Excess water shall not be allowed to

leave the property or area being watered.

- ♦ The use of water hoses without a shut-off nozzle is prohibited.
- ♦ Watering outdoor landscaping while raining is prohibited.
- Program sprinklers to run 3-5 minutes at a time.

#### **BE KIND TO YOUR NEIGHBORS!**

The loud raucous operation of any of the following are prohibited:

Monday - Friday before 7 a.m. or after 9 p.m. & Saturday, Sunday & State/Federal Holidays before 8 a.m. or after 9 p.m.

- 1. A hammer, or any other device used to pound or strike an object.
- 2. An impact wrench or tool/equipment powered by compressed air.
- 3. A hand powered saw.
- 4. Any tool/equipment powered by an internal-combustion engine (Chain saw, blower & lawn mower, etc.).
- 5. Any electrically powered tool/equipment used for cutting, drilling, or shaping wood plastic, or other materials (saw, drill, lathe, router, etc.).
- 6. Any heavy equipment (bulldozer, steam shovel, road grader, back hoe, etc.); ground drilling & boring equipment (derrick or dredge, etc.); hydraulic crane & boom equipment, portable power generator or pump, pavement equipment (pneumatic hammer, pavement breaker, tamper, compacting equipment); pile-driving equipment, vibrating roller, sand blaster, gunite machine, trencher, concrete truck & hot kettle pump.
- 7. Any construction, demolition, excavation, erection, alteration, or repair activity.

#### LIFEGUARDS NEEDED

ooking for a cool summer job? If so, get more information on American Red Cross training fees, dates and locations from the Recreation Department at 2060 McHenry Avenue or call 691-7372. First Aid for Public Safety Personnel (Title 22) may be required at a later date. Must be 15 years of age by the last day of training. #### **STORM WATER CORNER**

As you look along Escalon streets, you will find drain inlets that connect to the storm drain system. Storm lines collect runoff (rain) and materials found on streets, such as litter, pet waste, leaves, and grass clippings and transport it directly to creeks, rivers, and the ocean. When these materials enter creeks and rivers. they become pollutants that negatively affect water quality. Littering is against the law so place your trash into a garbage can. If you are hauling a load of trash or green waste to the dump or recycling station, be sure to securely cover the load to avoid flyaway trash. Public Works has labeled all City storm drain inlets with a circular label stating "Only Rain Down the Storm Drain". If you no-

tice a missing label, or see any-one illegally dumping into a storm drain, please contact the City Storm-water Line at 691-7495. ■
