





#### ♦ ELIMINATE WATER FROM **LEAVING YOUR PROPERTY -**

Excess water shall not be allowed to leave the property or area being watered.

♦ The use of water hoses without a shutoff valve is prohibited.

#### **CODE ENFORCEMENT REMINDERS**

Trailers, Vessels & Vehicles in street: Cannot be parked in the street for more than 72 hours (hitched or unhitched). When relocated, they cannot be parked within 1/10 of a mile of where originally cited. Locate them onto your private property or properly stored at a storage location (EMC 10.12). RV's over 20 feet are not allowed to be parked in the street Monday

1. Portable basketball hoops: Cannot be kept in the street or on the sidewalk. Move the hoops up into the driveway, or if you do play with them in the street; remind yourself to put them away when finished playing.

- 2. Vehicles on private property: Need to be maintained in a clean fashion. Keep the undercarriage of vehicle free of cobwebs. leaves and other debris. NO PARKING ON YOUR LAWN.
- 3. Garage sale signs: Remove all garage sale signs promptly after sale.
- 4. Yard waste pick-up in street: Public Works does not provide

yard waste removal from the streets. Use the Gray or Green can for yard waste.

- Sheds & Accessory Buildings: Contact the City of Escalon Development Services before you build or erect a structure on your property to ensure setback regulations, and zoning rules are followed.
- 7. Grass and brush: Keep yards and lots clear of brush and keep grass height mowed at 6 inches or shorter.

#### SWIM LESSONS

We anticipate swim lessons back for the 2021 swim season. Swim lessons run in two week sessions; lessons are a 1/2 hour, Monday-Thursday.

Parent/Guardian MUST be in the pool assisting child in levels 1 & 2, may be required in level 3 depending on skill level.

Fee per session: \$40 1st child; \$30 each additional child in the same family. A \$10 out of district fee will be added to all participants residing outside the EUSD boundaries.

#### STORM WATER CORNER

Residential water runoff from rain. hosing down driveways/ sidewalks, and sprinkler overwatering collects oil, gas, pet waste, heavy metals, fertilizers, leaves, and grass clippings on its way down the gutter to the storm drain. These materials enter local creeks and rivers untreated and become pollutants that negatively affect water quality. Sweep driveways and sidewalks instead of hosing down. Adjust sprinkler timers so that water does not leave the property. Public Works has labeled all City storm drain inlets with a circular label stating "Only Rain Down the Storm Drain". If you notice a missing label, or see

anyone illegally dumping into storm drain, please contact the City Stormwater Line at 691-7495. ■
