**BE WATER WISE DURING HOT SUMMER MONTHS!!!!** 

The first half of Water Year 2021 is over, the first six months of the water year rank as the fourth driest on record. Summer's high heat and long days result in an increased demand on our city's water system.

- Please set your landscape watering schedule to the early morning hours between 12:00am and 4:00am.
- **<u>ELIMINATE WATER FROM LEAVING YOUR PROPERTY</u>** Excess water shall not be allowed to leave the property or area being watered.
- ♦ The use of water hoses without a shut-off nozzle is prohibited.
- No watering on Mondays
- ♦ No outdoor watering between the hours of 8am-8pm.

By making some adjustments you will conserve water and reduce

your water bills. If we all work together, we can make a difference for California's future.

#### **STORMWATER CORNER**

hen caring for your lawn or garden, sweep fertilizer, soil and other debris from sidewalks and driveways instead of hosing them off. The flowing water will wash the pollutants into streams. rivers, and lakes. Avoid overwatering after applying lawn and garden chemicals to reduce the concentrations of pollutants in stormwater runoff. Use non-toxic pest controls such as insecticidal soaps or lady bugs for aphids. Wash your car on the grass rather than in the street so the soapy water does not flow directly into the storm drain. To report illegal dumping into storm

drains, please call the 209-691-7450.■
