DROUGHT EMERGENCY DECLARED!

The state and county have declared a drought emergency and are encouraging customers to reduce their water use by 20%

The state has also added a ban on irrigating turf at commercial, industrial and institutional properties.

◆ OBSERVE WATERING HOURS Even addresses may water Sunday, Wednesday and Friday.

Odd addresses may water Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday.

Non-watering hours are 8:00am - 8:00pm and NO watering on Mondays.

- **<u>ELIMINATE WATER FROM LEAVING YOUR PROPERTY</u>** Excess water shall not be allowed to leave the property or area being watered.
- ♦ The use of water hoses without a shut-off nozzle is prohibited.
- ♦ Program sprinklers to run 3-5 minutes at a time, preferably between the hours of 12am & 4am.

STORMWATER CORNER

hen caring for your lawn or garden, sweep fertilizer, soil and other debris from sidewalks and driveways instead of hosing them off. The flowing water will wash the pollutants into streams. rivers, and lakes. Avoid overwatering after applying lawn and garden chemicals to reduce the concentrations of pollutants in stormwater runoff. Use non-toxic pest controls such as insecticidal soaps or lady bugs for aphids. Wash your car on the grass rather than in the street so the soapy water does not flow directly into the storm drain.
